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23-24 Season

Opera Fuoco is very proud to celebrate its 20th anniversary and the 15th anniversary of the Opera Fuoco Young Artists Program during the 23/24 season!

I've had the great joy of working with many talented young singers since we began and watching them develop into fantastic artists and performers. We are proud to have guided five generations of talent and to continue to offer a unique three-year professional training program that we are celebrating in style.

The 23/24 season will reflect the breadth and diversity of the artistic program that Opera Fuoco has developed with passion and determination over twenty years in order to offer a demanding and encouraging environment for young talents and a place for audiences to share and discover our sense of purpose and our spirit of music-making.

In the summer of 2023, Fuoco Obbligato was on the festival circuit with a tour of the Latte e Miele chamber music program. The success of this new branch of Opera Fuoco continues this fall with Apollo e Dafne, Handel's powerful cantata which offers exceptional arias for singers and instrumentalists alike. The concert will take place at the Château d'Ecouen, Musée National de la Renaissance, one of our new partners. Opera Fuoco will perform in the United States for the first time in February 2024, when Fuoco Obbligato will tour to Palm Beach, Miami, Winter Park and Naples.

September will see festive revivals of our pocket-size Nozze di Figaro in Normandy and our concert version of Mayr's L'amor conjugale at the Theater an der Wien in Austria. The Opera Fuoco Orchestra and six former soloists from our Young Artists Program, who recorded this unjustly overlooked work with us in 2021 for the Aparté label, are delighted to return to the international stage!

Next April, we will have the immense privilege of presenting our 20th anniversary concert at the Théâtre des Champs-Élysées in our fourth collaboration with Les Grandes Voix. Karine Deshayes will be the mentor of this exceptional evening, which will bring together many renowned soloists, all graduates of the Opera Fuoco Young Artists Program.

The season closes with a promising collaboration with the Chœur de chambre de Namur for a concert version of Handel's Hercules, a nod to our company's first performance in 2003, which took place under a starry sky in the ancient ruins of the Acropolis - a good omen for the debut of our residency at the Opéra de Massy!

Opera Fuoco is renewing its commitment to large-scale educational projects as this production of Handel's Hercules will be at the heart of a project around the representation of heroes in opera which will involve students from Massy and Ecouen schools.

There will be plenty of opportunities to come and hear us, to discover and rediscover talents. We hope to see you soon!

Latte e Miele

Latte e Miele | Fuoco Obbligato concerts

In this program of baroque obbligato arias, Fuoco Obbligato explores the human relationship with nature in its musical expression and poetic context.

We begin in the kingdom of love, with images of the ocean's pearls, a flowing brook and milk dripping from ancient oaks - an evocative landscape full of promise in which the instrumental lines are melodious and sensual. We transition to a terrain of unrequited and lost love reflected by the mournful warbling of a flute, a lonely violin echoing the voice, or an eerie tapestry of sparse and hollow instrumental interiections in Rameau's Lieux désolez which creates an atmosphere of utter anguish. Vivaldi's aria brings us out of the melancoly depths, in which the lively 3/8 rhythm of the violin consoles the protagonist, and a spirited cello line propels us back to the anticipation of amorous encounters. Ultimately the soft breezes of Bach's wedding cantata join with Boyce's uplifting aria which speaks of flowing sweets and spicy gardens.

Le Nozze di Figaro | Mozart Opera

Since 2020, Opera Fuoco and director Alexandre Camerlo have performed The Marriage of Figaro in several different formats : mini-series broadcast on Marquee.TV, staging in theaters and openair ... This performance retains the sextet and piano version, the intimacy of which reflects the chamber music nature of Mozart's score. The approach will allow the soloists to deepen their knowledge of the roles in this opera through their interactions with the instrumentalists. The unique musical rendition and staging presented here underline the intensity of Mozart's and Da Ponte's masterpiece.

L'amor conjugale | Mayr Opera in concert version

L'amor conjugale tells the same story as Beethoven's Fidelio, but in a charmingly different adaptation of the original French text by the Italian librettist Gaetano Rossi. In Giovanni Simone Mayr's hand, the conjugal love is not just between the two principal characters Amorveno and Zeliska, but also between two theatrical and musical traditions, a love affair between two styles developed north and south of the alps. While the orchestration is clearly influenced by Mozart and Haydn, the vocal writing is often purely bel canto, and this blending of styles is one of the most attractive and unique attributes of the opera.

Having established himself as a teacher in Bergamo, Mayr taught a young student named Gaetano Donizetti, after which the composer from Bavaria was hailed as the father of bel canto. Pascal Duc, who prepared a new, critical edition for Opera Fuoco, writes, "we are at the height of bel canto and Mayr crafts wonderful vocal ensembles duos, trios, quartets and sextets, not to mention the unforgettable melodies which remain with us until we hear the next one! The proportions are perfect and in one act of ninety minutes, everything is said - with humor, gravitas and of course plenty of sentiment."

After its premiere at the Teatro Nuovo in Padua in1805, L'amor conjugale had many celebrated successes throughout Europe for decades. Simone Mayr reveals himself as an important voice in the development of the bel canto style and deserves to be recognized today for his significant contribution to the 19th century operatic repertoire. L'amor conjugale is a musical gem not to be neglected.

On the Boulevard! | Masterclass & Encounter-concert

Since Baron Haussmann's urban revolution at the turn of the 1860s, Paris has become a city of boulevards. These vast avenues were created to give an impression of space and invite visitors to stroll under plane and lime trees. Boulevard Sébastopol, Saint-Michel, Haussmann, des Italiens or de Grenelle, a myriad of major avenues that have created an identity for each of the districts they pass through. In the early 20th century, Boulevard du Montparnasse welcomed a colony of talented artists to its cafés, cinemas and sidewalks. This new bohemia brought to the Left Bank the dynamism of modernity and a new generation of designers. Balthus, Zadkine and even the very young Serge Gainsbourg passed through the Académie de La Grande Chaumière, while the terraces of Le Dôme and La Coupole were home to Foujita, Cocteau, Apollinaire, Picasso, Stein, Baker, Gershwin, Milhaud, Chagall and Modigliani. To evoke the creative effervescence of the "Paris of the Moderns", Opera Fuoco, David Stern and Laurent Naouri take the audience on a musical stroll along Boulevard Montparnasse, with excerpts from operettas, operas, music-hall works and melodies by Poulenc. Tailleferre. Honegger, Porter, Yvain. Gershwin... all regulars at the joyous Montpar'.

In this chamber program, Fuoco Obbligato highlights the splendid use by Handel and his contemporaries of arias with obbligato instruments. Amore's first aria in Johann Joseph Fux's opera Dafne in Lauro, composed five years after Apollo e Dafne, replaces the lost overture to Handel's magnificent work, precursor of his immense operatic oeuvre. In it Cupid boasts of his irresistible powers which are reenforced by the solo cello line. He is then challenged by Apollo, who asserts at the start of Handel's dramatic cantata that his weapons are more powerful than the arrows of this winged foe. As the story unfolds, Apollo's pursuit of the beautiful nymph Dafne brings us face to face with the contemporary problem of unbalanced, non-consensual relationships. In the duet A war rages in my breast, Dafne expresses her refusal to be abused in this way, as well as her unshakeable allegiance to the chaste goddess Diana. Although they share the same melody, their feelings and words could not be more discordant. In order to be saved from Apollo's advances, Dafne is transformed into a laurel tree, losing both her form and her voice. Apollo pays tribute to the beautiful nymph in his sentimental final lament, and declares that he will crown the greatest heroes with her laurels. To conclude Fuoco Obbligato's rendition of Ovid's myth, a second aria from the opera Dafne in Lauro finally offers us a moral and the fiery Amore returns to the stage with an aria full of mischievous exchanges between oboe and violin, during which he concedes, in a brief but heartfelt adagio, that despite his many tricks, it is virtue that has the greatest value.

Sarah Bernhardt (1844 - 1923) represents the tragedienne par excellence. Internationally recognized, she inspired some of the greatest writers of her time (Edmond Rostand, Catulle Mendès...) and was admired by great minds such as Victor Hugo, Sacha Guitry or Emile Zola. She gave the "French theater" an international reputation at a time when globalization was still inconceivable.

Although she made only one appearance into music as a recitalist in Gabriel Pierné's Izéÿl, Sarah Bernhardt lived through an era of great change for music and frequented many musicians and librettists. She was a friend of Gounod, Saint-Saëns and Debussy.

"Madame Sarah" created and embodied theatrical roles that were almost immediately set to music. La Tosca, Gioconda, Dona Sol, Gismonda and Fédora were born with theatrical play before becoming immortal under the pens of Puccini, Verdi and Giordano.

Inspired by the muse that was Sarah Bernhardt, this program will trace her career in music. It is also an opportunity for the singers of the Opera Fuoco Young Artists Program to lend their voices to the great opera pages in Italian and French and to rediscover the fabulous energy that inhabited Sarah Bernhardt.

Amor Diletto | Fuoco Obbligato concerts

In this 1-hour program celebrating love and lifted out of the baroque opera repertoire, Fuoco Obbligato brings together some of the most beautiful arias for soprano, tenor and baroque instruments. These arias often capture the most intimate moments of a largerscale work, perfectly reflecting this human emotion. The dialogue between the singer and the instrumental soloist is nuanced and reveals the complexities of love - we find everything from sensuality and languishing melancholy to cheeky humor and outright theatricality.

Amor is both a piercing bowman and a playful cherub, a devastating tempter of fate and a forgivable joiner of hearts. The program ends with the delightful duet from Handel's pastoral ode, a reassuring philosophical contemplation of the purity of the heart winning over the fanciful mind...

Endless pleasure | Masterclass &Encounter-concert

Of all Baroque composers, Georg Friedrich Handel was the most cosmopolitan. Born in Germany and moving to Italy in his twenties, he quickly established himself as one of the masters of Italian opera style, a reputation that open the doors for him to move to England in 1720. When the disenchantment of the London public truncated his operatic career in Italian, Handel managed to survive by re-inventing the English oratorio. He even created a long-lasting tradition with composers such as Arne, Smith and Boyce who followed him into the Victorian era.

The oratorio's success lies in Handel's championing of word-painting and his sensitivity to the English language as a source of contrast and color. He is as comfortable with Semele's operatic lyricism as he is with Jephtha's gravitas. Unlocking the secrets to interpreting Handel's genius is essential for any opera singer. Opera Fuoco and David Stern propose an exploration of these great frescoes, where music and language are adorned with Handel's theatrical and sacred palette. For an in-depth look at the subtle nuances of English oratorios from the second half of the 18th century, David Stern invites soprano Rosemary Joshua, whose incarnations of Handelian heroines in oratorio and opera are iconic. 

Hercules | Handel Opera in concert version

A monument to Greek tragedy, Sophocles' Trachinia immortalizes the timeless drama of marital jealousy. Hercules returns from the siege of Oechaly with a war hostage, the young lole. Faced with the beautiful prisoner, Dejanira, wife of the hero, is driven by jealousy to kill the invincible Hercules with the poisoned tunic of the centaur Nessos. This plot inspired George Frideric Handel to write a score of great inventiveness, which he premiered in London in 1745 in a concert version. Although the London audience, which was accustomed to oratorios, did not like the premiere, this musical tragedy contains some of Handel's most innovative pieces, such as the chorus "Jealousy infernal pest".

Contrary to the claims of the reference edition, Hercules is not an oratorio. Handel always wanted it to be considered a musical drama, and thus an opera in English. In order to reinforce the dramatic tension and to give Hercules its operatic colors, David Stern proposes an interpretation based on the original manuscript and the reworkings that Handel made in 1749 and 1752. Opera Fuoco & David Stern collaborate with the Chamber Choir of Namur to celebrate the 2024 Paris Olympic Games by honoring the greatest hero in Greco-Roman mythology.
